Radicalisation and Violent Extremism
Prevention in the Community

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Individuals sentenced for terrorism-related offences and those radicalised or at-risk of radicalisation pose a significant threat especially after their release from prison.

Consequently, rehabilitation efforts must combine different actors throughout the process, enhancing the role of civil society, namely through non-governmental organisations (NGOs).

NGOs can provide a good support network to help with these individuals' post-release challenges. Moreover, by fostering positive and trustful relationships, NGOs can increase the chances of successful rehabilitation and reintegration.

• R2COM focuses on strengthening a communitarian approach to P/CVE

The main goal is to improve the skills of NGOs' professionals and guide them to adequately conduct risk assessments and interventions with newly released radical or at-risk individuals.



Assess

- Up-to-date state of the art analysis and mapping of the best and promising P/CVE practices used by NGOs in Europe
- Adaption of the Frontline Behavioural Observation Guidelines* instrument to be implemented by NGOs' staff (focusing on gender and four types of extremism: Islamist, right-wing, left-wing and single-issue)



Network

- Establishment of a comprehensive online network comprising European NGOs' professionals working with radicalised or at-risk individuals
- Engagement of NGOs' professionals in multi-level and dynamic activities



Train

- Development of an innovative b-Learning programme to capacitate NGOs' staff with relevant competencies in the P/CVE field
- Specialised P/CVE training events for community practitioners
- Design of a handbook with rigorous and validated guidelines to procedurally standardise NGOs' practices in the P/CVE field



Disseminate

- The project website gives an account of project results and research products
- Multiplier events gathering experts and NGOs' professionals will reach a broad audience across Europe
- Continuous dissemination of presswork and publications



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
